Planning Priority #1

Social Emotional Learning -

Strategies and Success Indicators

- Opportunities for all students to have teaching and access to tools that support self-regulation

Planning Priority #2

Numeracy- Focus on Foundational Math

Strategies and Success Indicators

- Grade Level teams will identify specific math outcomes to focus on for the year based on student results from last year
- Teachers will participate in Teaching Sprints, focusing on their chosen outcomes
- Numeracy Learning Coach providing additional numeracy PD for teaching staff during February school based PD day

- NES Literacy Teacher providing additional literacy PD for teaching staff during staff meetings and after school PLCs
