Planning Priority #1

Social Emotional Learning - Character

Strategies and Success Indicators

- Staff and students will have opportunities to learn about the “Character” competency of the 6Cs of Deeper Learning
- Throughout the school year, we will focus on different character traits in school-wide assemblies and in class instruction
- Opportunities for all students to develop skills and attributes associated with the chosen character traits: Responsibility, Perseverance, Empathy, Gratitude, Bravery, Kindness, Honesty, Creativity

Planning Priority #2

Numeracy- Focus on Problem-Solving

Strategies and Success Indicators

- Grade Level teams will explore strategies and new resources for helping students grow in problem solving
- Teachers will participate in Teaching Sprints with a focus on developing flexible thinking and a growth mindset through problem solving
- Students will have regular opportunities to practice problem solving with a growth math mindset.

Planning Priority #3

Literacy - Communicating through Writing

Strategies and Success Indicators

- Students will build their writing “toolbox” through the use of the Syntax Project
- Teachers will participate in Teaching Sprints, focusing on grade specific writing goals.

Planning Priority #4

Learning Partnerships- Home/School/Community

Strategies and Success Indicators

- Our students will continue to partner with other classes for collaborative learning experiences both in our school and with the older students at NMS.
- Students, staff, and families will have opportunities throughout the school year to engage and learn with Indigenous Knowledge Keepers and Elders
- Students will become connected to community members through local events such as Opa’s park visits, Christmas carolling, school concerts, partnerships with seniors, the Nighthawks Hockey Team and local experts.
